How to Be Holiday Safe

The holidays are upon us all and I would like to remind everyone that this time of year typically requires increased safety practices.

Please remember to clear all fire hydrants of any accumulations of snow. Minutes could make the difference.

Do not use residential type extension cords within any commercial business. These types of cords are not properly rated to deal with the higher electrical draws in a commercial environment. The use of surge type devices is recommended however always verify use as per the manufacturer.

Exercise extreme caution when using open flames such as candles and the like. Do not become complacent and think a tragedy cannot happen to you; it most certainly can!

Verify that your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are functional. Replace devices that are over 10 years old.

Please note that I have \underline{FREE} battery

operated smoke detectors that can be provided to town residents in need of these life saving devices. These are made available via a program sponsored by the State Division of Fire Safety and Kidde. Please contact me in order to obtain these free devices.

WINTER <u>ON-STREET</u> Ø OVERNIGHT PARKING

From November 15th to April 1st parking is prohibited on all streets in the

WINTER OFF-STREET PUBLIC PARKING WHEN SNOW IS FORECAST

Overnight off-street public parking is available in the Water Street Lot, the Lower Center Street Lot, the Municipal Building Lot and in authorized spaces in the Firehouse Parking Lot. <u>Please remember however that the</u> <u>Water Street, Municipal Building and</u> <u>Firehouse Parking Lots are 24 hour</u> <u>lots and your vehicle must be moved</u> <u>after each 24 hour period to facilitate</u> <u>snow removal</u>. If you have any questions please ask a police officer prior to making any assumptions regarding parking in these lots.

SNOW REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALKS

So that school children and adult pedestrians can find safe passage on our sidewalks, Ordinance 115-1 requires that the owner or tenant of property abutting or adjacent to a sidewalk must remove all snow and ice from that sidewalk or public right-of-way within 12 hours of daylight from the time that the snow or frozen precipitation ceased to fall or accumulate.

Lessons learned from years past about snow/ice removal in Clinton include:

1. Its much $\underline{\text{EASIER}}$ to remove the snow/ice $\underline{\text{IMMEDIATELY}}$ after it

ceases to fall than it is after it \underline{melts} and $\underline{re-freezes}$.

2. Don't count on the snow or ice melting and disappearing by itself within 12 hours of daylight after it ceased to fall (see lesson #1 above).

3. It is illegal to deposit snow or ice from your sidewalk or driveway onto the street after the street has been plowed. We highly recommend that you shovel the snow away from the street and not into it. You will be reported by the Public Works Department and you will receive a summons if you are caught doing this.

4. There are many seniors in Town who find it difficult if not impossible to shovel their sidewalks and driveways, so help a neighbor who may need it. This is also a great opportunity for teenage entrepreneurs to make some extra spending money. If you would like to be contacted to help someone in need of shoveling assistance please contact the Clerk's Office at the municipal building.

CAT & DOG LICENSING

ATTENTION ALL RESIDENTS: All cats and dogs are required to be licensed in the Town of Clinton, even in-door pets. Animal licensing fees for 2015 are Dogs spayed/neutered \$10.20 non-spayed/non neutered \$13.20; for Cats spayed/neutered \$7.00 non-spayed/non neutered \$10.00. A census was taken of all surrounding municipalities and we were found to be extremely low. The State will no longer be providing the serum for the free rabies clinic so therefore this fee will accommodate for that. We are still below the average costs for pets. Also, late fees will be \$4.00 per month. Every year we have many delinquent pets and send letters, make phone calls, and as a last resort, Police issue summons. A summons may cost \$80.00 plus the cost of licensing your pets. Hopefully this will encourage all pet owners to quickly respond to their renewals that are mailed in December and due by January 31st.


