The meeting has been called to order joining the water and roads committees to discuss modifications and proposed changes to the Stormwater Ordinance. In accordance with NJDEP, each municipality is required to update its stormwater management ordinance to make it consistent with the new state rule by March 2, 2021. The new rule mandates the use of green infrastructure to treat stormwater runoff for new major developments and represents the minimum requirements for Town ordinances.

Attorney St. Angelo asked Council to consider two definitions, stormwater and site plan issues. Suggestion was made to adopt State template now and the Mayor Kovach to present it to the DEP for a definition of impervious coverage. Then to follow up with Mayor Kovach after her meeting with DEP.

Mr. Phelan suggested introducing in November for adoption in December. To adopt the template and to work through the Highlands side of it. The Highlands is a bit more stringent with regards to impervious surface, meaning any structure, surface, or improvement that reduces or prevents absorption of stormwater absorption. Ms. Karsh explained her willingness to comply with the Highlands and in making for a more green infrastructure but not so strict as to be a draconian government.

A motion was made by Ms. Intrabartola, seconded by Ms. Karsh, to proceed with the DEP template and for Mr. Phelan to follow up.
