Mayor's Comments

Mayor Kovach wished everyone a very Happy Thanksgiving!

Council Comments

Councilwoman Johnson stated that she listened to the County's COVID Briefing and said that Hunterdon County was very lucky during the first phase of COVID. She said we are now averaging 40-60 new cases per day. There is increased testing and home testing. Hunterdon County is in a high risk zone now. If you have any symptoms you must quarantine for 14 days. Most of the cases are arising out of parties, sleepovers and sporting events. She reiterated the importance of wearing a mask.

Councilwoman Intrabartola stated that the insurance for the parade was approved by Caroline Conboy, our insurance broker. She also stated that we may need to add a layer to Tier A where we can waive the umbrella portion of the insurance if the participant has extra liability coverage that exceeds our minimum.

Councilman Humphrey stated that they had their one year review of the website. They found some deficiencies on some of the Boards and Commissions. They will be asked to review the content and advise whether it needs to be updated.

There was a discussion regarding notification of the parade on the website. Chief Kubinak stated that the notification will go on the website next week which will include a statement that wearing a mask is mandatory.

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act; *N.J.S.A.* 10:4-6 *et seq.*, declares it to be the public policy of the State to insure the right of citizens to have adequate advance notice of and the right to attend meetings of public bodies at which business affecting the public is discussed or acted upon; and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act also recognizes exceptions to the right of the public to attend portions of such meetings; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council find it necessary to conduct an executive session closed to the public as permitted by the *N.J.S.A.* 40:4-12; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council will reconvene in public session at the conclusion of the executive session;

NOW, **THEREFORE**, BE IT **RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Clinton, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey that they will conduct an executive session to discuss the following topic(s) as permitted by *N.J.S.A.* 40:4-12:

A matter where the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the federal government;
A matter whose disclosure would constitute an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy.

Matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his or her ethical duties as a lawyer; (The general nature of the matter is: Land Acquisition OR the public disclosure of such information at this time would have a potentially negative impact on the municipality's position with respect to the matter being discussed; therefore this information will be withheld until such time as the matter is concluded or the potential for negative impact no longer exists);
Matters involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance, promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective or current public officer or employee of the public body, where all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected have not requested in writing that the matter(s) be discussed at a public meeting; (The employee(s) and/or general nature of discussion is
ORthe public disclosure of such information at this time would violate the employee(s) privacy rights; therefore this information will be withheld until such time as the matter is concluded or the threat to privacy rights no longer exists.;
Deliberation occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty or loss of a license or permit;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council hereby declare that their discussion of the subject(s) identified above may be made public at a time when the Town

Attorney advises them that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the Town or any other entity with
respect to said discussion. That time is currently estimated to be:
