Geoff Long, development principal from Ingerman, was available at this meeting to answer questions from the Mayor and Council and the public comments. Many residents attended the meeting via zoom and had lots of public comment for both public hearings on the ordinances.

Kyle Perloff, 28 West Main Street, explained that he is a new resident in Town and asked what exactly does this redevelopment plan refer to. Mayor Kovach explained the area of the former A&P was designated as an "Area in Need of Redevelopment" and as part of the Fair Share Housing Plan this ordinance must be put in place. Fire Chief Jeff Hedden said he received the updated drawings and reviewed them with Jack Daniels, the Fire Official, and the dimensions of the fire truck were incorrect but have been corrected. Mr. Long explained the amended plan, 6,000 sq. ft. of retail space on the first floor, 120 rental apartments. Mr. Long met with Michael Margulies AIA, an architect specializing in historic structures and gave design suggestions for the new development's facade. Ms. Karsh, 116 Center Street, asked if the retail space would be designed to connect the proposed retail space with the downtown shopping district in a street scaping plan and Mr. Long was happy to say yes! The plan is to have it connect with strip of stores located next to the site, directing shopping in that direction. Meg Mullin, 35 West Main Street, expressed concerns of light pollution but that is a topic for the Land Use Board to address. Paul Kipp, 33 West Main Street, asked about setbacks, Paul. Balasic, 45 West Main Street questioned the number of units and was told for every one affordable housing unit we get four market rate units.

Questions addressed number of housing units, traffic, light pollution, the Lansdown Trail parking and accessibility, an access road that would lead behind existing properties and the possibility of car access alongside the trail that could take folks to the Ramsey Road access, avoiding traveling on West Main Street and the traffic situation. Also a concern was the influx to Clinton Public School, to which Councilwoman Johnson replied that the housing would be mostly age restricted and special needs housing which would not add children to the school system.

Walter Wilson, principal of Clinton Development Partners, gave an overview of the proposed plans for the Global Agway/Fox Lumber site. The original building will house a micro brew / distillery towards the rear of the building. The developers would like to see an open market in the front of the building, similar to the Easton Market or the Stockton Market, but not to carry items that would compete with the shops on Main Street. Mr. Wilson is also focusing on street scape frontage and architectural design to tie it in the Town's early years.

Mr. Phelan updated Council to the two major projects that will be taking place. The temporary water services on West Main Street will begin the week of August 17. This phase should take approximately three weeks and the following stage will be to remove old water mains.

Sewer Committee has been meeting twice a month to discuss the wastewater treatment plant filter building project. The press itself weighs 18,000 lbs. assembled and delivered and the next stage to begin outside working to the equipment installed. Former WWTP Superintendent, Paul Klitsch, will assist the engineer during the project.

Attorney Tara St. Angelo

The 2020 tax appeals have been settled by Fran Kuczynski, the Tax Assessor. Ms. St. Angelo commented Fran on a great job and minimal loss, fair to Town and appellant.

The Fairness & Compliance hearing was held last Friday at the Somerset County Courthouse, we are in conditional compliance with the court and close to finalizing.

Environmental Commission will be sharing a proposed property maintenance ordinance with Shade Tree and the Land Use Board.
