Ms. Karsh announced she is happy to have been elected to Council and looks forward to working with everyone. Ms. Johnson echoed Ms. Karsh's sentiments!

Mr. Smith gave the schedule for regular committee meetings:

Roads Committee meeting the first Friday of the month Buildings & Grounds meet the first Monday of the month Water Committee meets the third Wednesday of the month

Sewer Committee meets at the Treatment Plant the third Friday of month.

Mr. Rylak said he will be meeting with Mr. Phelan to discuss his new duties as a member of the Personnel Committee as well as Water and Sewer Committees.

Ms. Olsen, CFO, reported that \$463,000 of prepaid taxes have been collected. Attorney Tara St. Angelo stated that Senator Leonard Lance is co-sponsoring a bill for homeowners to be able to prepay an entire year.
