

This is a list of tree species that are recommended for homeowners in the Town of Clinton:

Tall Shade Trees (mature to heights of 45 to 80+ feet)

(plant in locations with no overhead wires and away from structures)

White Oak (Quercus alba)

Northern Red Oak (Quercus rubra)

Black Cherry (Prunus serotina)

Tulip (Liriodendron tulipifera)

Shagback Hickory (Carya ovata)

Black Gum (Nyssa sylvatica)

Sugar Maple (Acer saccharum)

Persimmon (Diospyros virginiana)

Lindens: American linden/Basswood (Tilia americana)

Red maple (Acer rubrum)

Sweetgum (Liquidambar styraciflua)

Medium Flowering or Ornamental Trees (25 to 40 feet tall)

American Hophornbeam, Ironwood (Ostrya virginiana)

Small Flowering or Ornamental Trees (10 to 30 feet tall)

American hornbeam (Carpinus caroliniana)

Carolina Silverbell (Halesia carolina)

Serviceberry (Amelanchier)

Redbud (Cercis canadensis)

Hawthorn (Crataegus)

Flowering dogwood (Cornus florida)

Trees to Avoid

Ash – all untreated trees are being killed by the emerald ash borer.

Bradford & Callery pear (Pyrus species) – invasive/hazardous; brittle wood causes tree to fall apart. Fringetree – vulnerable to emerald ash borer.

Norway maple - a non-native which has become extremely invasive in the northeast USA.

Zelkova – a non-native which has been over-planted in NJ and has become invasive.
